## CONDITIONS FOR FOOTPATH HOARDING 2010/11



- 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of the OH&S Regulations 2001, Chapter 8, Construction Work, any hoarding that is required to be erected on or over a public place, including roads and footpaths, requires approval under the Local Government Act 1993 and Roads Act 1993.
- 2. Type "A" hoarding refers to protective fencing and shall be certified by a Structural Engineer that it is adequate for the purpose for which it is constructed.
  - Type "B" hoarding refers to overhead protective structures and shall be certified by a Structural Engineer that it is constructed in accordance with the WorkCover Authority Code of Practice.
- 3. Type "A" hoardings shall be allowed to encroach upon a public footpath up to a maximum distance of 1.5m from the building/property alignment, however a lesser distance from the building/property alignment may be required at the discretion of Councils Asset Manager in order to ensure adequate footpath width for pedestrians. Consideration may be given to encroachment greater that 1.5m subject to additional works such as the provision of road barriers to enable pedestrian access.
- 4. Hoardings shall remain in place until work is complete.
- 5. Hoardings shall be painted white and kept clean to the satisfaction of the Asset Manager.
- 6. Suitable lighting is to be provided and maintained for the illumination of the footpath and hoarding from sunset to sunrise, so as to reduce hazard to persons using the footpath or surroundings.
- 7. No advertisements of any kind shall be affixed to the hoardings, excepting a board on which may be shown the architect's and builder's names, particulars in respect of the subject building, and notices in respect of the existing or future occupancies of the building.
- 8. A sign "Bill Posters will be Prosecuted" shall be displayed on the front elevation of the hoarding.
- 9. Hydrants or other service access points shall not be covered in any way, and access to same must be kept clear at all times.
- 10. Uprights shall be tenoned into soleplates and shall not be inserted into the roadway or footpath surface.
- 11. The hoarding shall be constructed in a good and workmanlike manner, and kept in a state of good and safe repair at all times.
- 12. Hoardings shall be constructed so as not to obstruct the motorist's or pedestrian's view of traffic lights, and pedestrian crossings are to be freely accessible and visible at all times.
- 13. Approval to erect a hoarding does not confer the right to use the roadway for the loading and unloading of goods, nor the positioning of cranes upon a public way. Inquiries with respect to these matters should be addressed to Council's Asset Management Department.
- 14. The applicant shall be responsible for any damage or accident, which may occur on account of the roadway or footpath being occupied for this purpose. The applicant shall be required to pay for the reinstatement of any portion of the footpath or roadway which may be disturbed or injured by building work, remove all building material, and leave the premises in a good order and condition, to the satisfaction of the Asset Manager.
- 15. The applicant shall indemnify Council in the event of any member of the public suffering injury to person or property by reason of the presence of the hoarding.
- 16. The applicant shall, during the work, maintain an appropriate Public Liability Insurance Policy of not less than \$10 million. The Policy shall be submitted to Council with the application for footpath hoarding and shall note Council's interest.
